

Allergy to Budesonide

What am I allergic to?

You have been found to be allergic to **Budesonide**.

What is Budesonide?

Budesonide is a glucocorticoid steroid for the treatment of asthma, non-infectious rhinitis (including hay fever and other allergies), and for treatment and prevention of nasal polyposis. Additionally, it is used for Crohn's disease (inflammatory bowel disease).

What must I avoid?

It probably means that you are allergic to **locoid**, **adcortyl**, **tri-adcortyl**, **halciderm** or **aureocort**.

You should avoid these creams in future.

You may also be allergic to other topical steroids and further skin test may be necessary to find out which steroid cream or ointment is safe for you to use.

Where can Budesonide be found?

It is marketed by **AstraZeneca** as a nasal inhalant under the brand name **Rhinocort**, as an oral inhalant under the brand name **Pulmicort**, and as either an enema or a modified release oral capsule under the brand name **Entocort**. It is also sold in combination with formoterol (Oxis) in a single inhaler, under the brand name **Symbicort**.

Rarely, it is prescribed as **Preferid** cream or ointment.
