

Allergy to Tixocortyl Pivalate

What am I allergic to?

You have been found to be allergic to **Tixocortyl Pivalate**.

What is Tixocortyl Pivalate?

Tixocortyl Pivalate is a corticosteroid belonging to the group A (hydrocortisone) type of steroids used in nasal sprays for the treatment of rhinitis.

What must I avoid?

Tixocortyl Pivalate is a good marker for group A corticosteroid contact allergy, and may cause airborne contact dermatitis.

You should therefore avoid using this nasal spray yourself, or being in close proximity to another user during use. You should avoid all medicaments that include tixocortyl pivalate in the list of ingredients, and be aware that you may also be allergic to:

- Hydrocortisone
- Hydrocortisone acetate
- Prednisolone
- Prednisolone acetate
- Fludrocortisone acetate
- Methylprednisolone
- Cloprednol
- Hydrocortisone-17-butyrate
- Hydrocortisone-17-aceponate
- Hydrocortisone-17-buteprate
- Methylprednisolone aceponate
- Prednicarbate

Where can Tixocortyl Pivalate be found?

Tixocortyl Pivalate is a widely used topical anti-inflammatory agent that may be found in both prescription and in non-prescription medications. Tixocortyl Pivalate may be found in creams, lotions, ointments, powders, ear, nose and eye drops for the treatment of eczema and other local inflammations. It may be used in combination with antibacterial.

Tixocortol Pivalate and related corticosteroids are also used in tablets or for injection. It may be present in rectal suspensions. Use of such medication may cause a flare up of your eczema.
